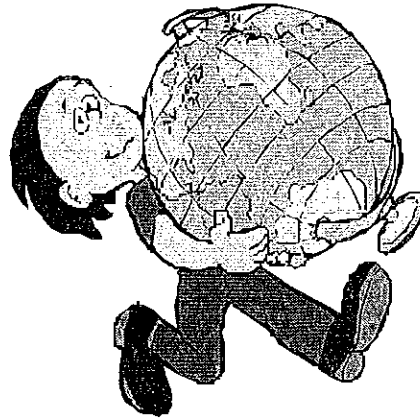


## RESEARCH PAPER ASSIGNMENT AND REQUIREMENTS

You are required to write a research paper on a country chosen in geography.

### PROCEDURES:

Complete any research  
Paraphrase research information.  
Complete your bibliography  
CITE quotes (copied info) in paper  
**MUST CITE EACH SOURCE USED SOMEWHERE in your paper.**  
Type paper in the Computer Lab



### REQUIREMENTS:

1. Take notes and paraphrase information
2. Write a rough draft.
3. Type the paper which must be **one paragraph for each requirement.. Must be plain print, double spaced. The number of pages is not assigned. It will be as long as it takes to write an introduction, a paragraph on each requirement, and a conclusion.**
4. Include an introductory paragraph
5. Include a concluding paragraph
6. Type the bibliography using proper form. **For a C- the author must have 2 sources , for a B- three sources , for an A- 4 sources.**
7. There must be a **Title page** with the name of your country, your name, the date, your class period, and the names Mr. Livingston and Mrs. Norgaard **centered** on the page.
8. A map of the country should be included, and you may enhance your paper with the picture of a flag and or anything else that will make your paper better.

## GEOGRAPHY / ENGLISH RESEARCH ASSIGNMENT

Write a research paper on the country you draw. Your report must include:

### INTRODUCTION

BRIEF HISTORY ( a brief history of the country)

### LAND

- physical description of country
- major physical features(bodies of water, mountains, deserts, etc)
- climate(identify type & describe)

### POLITICAL

- type of government
- describe how the government works
- capital & major cities
- population

### ECONOMY

- type of economy
- main products/services produced
- exports
- natural resources
- industries/commerc
- employment / types of jobs
- monetary unit (type of money)

### SOCIETY

- education / schools
- health
- birth rate & life expectancy
- religion(s)
- customs, folkways, manors, mores/tabooos

### FAMILY

- marriage / dating process
- family life
- recreation / hobbies
- dress & appearance

### FOOD & DIET

- popular foods, entries, deserts, & etc.

### MAP

- include major political and physical features (may have more than one map)
- identify neighboring countries

**Bibliography form to be used: Always put in alphabetical order**

**BOOK?**

last name of author, first name. Title of the book. City: Publishing Co. date.

EXAMPLE:

Chute, Mrchette. "Shakespeare of London." Prentice Hall Literature.  
Eileen Thompson, Englewood Cliffs: New Jersey, 1991. (pp. 24-53)

**ENCYCLOPEDIA?**

**author's name. "title". The World Book Encyclopedia. 1994 ed. (pp. 3-5) or**  
**"Mandarin," The World Book Encyclopedia. 1994 ed.**

**MAGAZINE?**

author. "Title." Sports Illustrated 15 Nov. date: pp. 3-5.

**CD-ROM**

BRIEF HISTORY

**SOCIETY** (education, health, birth rate, life expectancy, religions, folkways, manners, beliefs)

**LAND** (Physical des. and feature, climate)

**FAMILY** (dating, marriage, family life, recreation, hobbies, dress)

**POLITICAL** (government, capital, cities, population)

**FOOD AND DIET**

**ECONOMY** (type, exports, resources, industries, jobs, money)
