

Product Phases Timeline Website Project

Worth 100 Points

Scenario

Oh if only you could be as old as the instructor and remember just how cool it was to play games on the original Nintendo system. What deprived lives we lead, right? ☺ Products go through various stages of development. Most get improved and lead to improvements that we don't know how we lived without. This Web project is going to require you to design a Web site that effectively takes your viewers through the various developmental stages of a product of your choice. This should be a product that has gone through major transformations since its original creation. This is because you need to focus on at least five stages of your product's development.

This site needs to be a minimum of six pages. You will need to create a page for each product development stage. Your homepage (remember to name this either index or default) needs to be an overview of the five pages that make up your Web site. As far as text, each of your pages (with the exception of your homepage) should contain at least 10-15 sentences.

Try to think of a product that has been around for awhile. The computers of today do not look anything like they did 30-40 years ago. Although it is not a requirement, try to think of a product you use in your daily life. This should also help to make the project a little more enjoyable to complete as well. **Keep in mind you are NOT allowed to include any information that has been included on a previous Web project.**

Additional Requirements

Like all projects the material contained within each of your Web pages must be **school appropriate**. This applies to all information included within the project and it must NOT contain anything that might be considered offensive or disrespectful. Projects that do not follow this simple guideline will receive a **zero!**

References that indicate where you found pictures, information, or other materials should be included on the proper pages. **DO NOT** copy and paste information from one Website directly into your project. Summarize information, put it into your own words, and make it meaningful to you and your audience.

Don't forget to spell check! You will lose five points for each spelling error found within your project. **Also organization counts for this project.** Do you have folders for graphics, pages, documents, etc., or do you have a whole bunch of files in your main student folder?

After you have completed your Web project, please turn in your planning sheet, which has the grading rubric on the back of it. (Make sure your name is on it!). Remember your planning sheet is worth 10 points.
